

MY LIFE IS IN HIS HANDS – PSALM 31:14-15

The last six months or so of this year have been stressful. And it's not just that Donald Trump sucks up all the oxygen. Even in our own city – Toronto, things seem to have gotten out of control with the marked increase in gun violence. The volatility of the stock market is causing people to really query what is going on? "Burn out" is real! Believe it or not, the Christmas season is one of the high stress points of people's lives. And yet with all that is happening around us, the Bible – that ancient "quaint" book has much to say to us living in the age of stress.

David went through levels of stress like few of us have ever experienced. He wrote about it in Psalm 31. The Psalm was the result of the "pressure cooker" life that David was experiencing. David provides for us the key to handling stress in our lives — a situation that I believe will get worse as we draw toward the close of earth's history. "But as for me, I trust in You, O Lord, I say, 'You are my God.' My times are in Your hand." Psalm 31:14-15

It's obvious from Psalm 31 that David knew God in a very personal, practical and thorough way before he got into the crisis that prompted the Psalm. David didn't learn all that he declares about God out of the blue in the middle of this calamity, no, the Psalm comes from a lifetime of experience with God so that when the stress hit, David could lean upon God has his ultimate resource.

Here is something we can take to the bank — God will never allow us to go through more stress than we can bear if we trust in Him! Even though David's trial was terrifying, so that he despaired even of life itself, God gave him strength to endure. God isn't into easy solutions. He doesn't usually remove the trial the instant we seek Him. But none who have waited on Him have found Him to fail. "He gives more grace when the burdens grow greater!"

This year, some of you are going to feel like you're in over your head. The stress will seem overwhelming and you'll feel like your life is out of control. Guess what? We're never in control, even when we proudly think that we are! God wants us to see that we're always in over our heads! We're dependent on Him for the next breath we take and for our daily food. Our response to stress, whether it comes from the big crisis or from the daily routine, should be consciously, deliberately to put our trust in the sovereign, personal God who is never in over His head. We need to put our Life in His hands.

A TIME OF REFLECTION ON EVANGELISM: SOUND DOCTRINE

There is a quotation from the book "Lift Him Up", which popped into my head like those pop-ups on your computer screen as I reflected on our "Get Right with God" two-week evangelistic series (October 20th—November 5th, 2018). It brings together experience of the series in capsule form. It also delineates some pertinent aspects our youth at Mount Olive and elsewhere should keep at the forefront of all our evangelistic endeavors. As we consider the posterity of evangelism as it pertains not only to the saving of souls but also a way of preserving Seventh-day Adventist core doctrinal beliefs among the membership and community.

"Tell those for whom you are laboring how God blessed you when you stepped out by faith. Your life was tested, you experienced trials, but God was with you. Your life was richly blessed by Him." Lift Him Up p. 179

Sound Bible based doctrine was what Evangelist Dr. Fitzroy Maitland presented to the congregation, night after night for two weeks. Saints of God, trust the Lord in all things, step out in faith no matter the obstacles and He will richly reward you.

Youth Ministry is my favourite ministry because, it is full of exciting new ways to worship and helps the church to stay relevant. Youth ministry helps the church focus on the way of Jesus, which goes BEYOND tradition, to break barriers and find creative ways to reach those who don't know Him.

The sole purpose of working with young people is to help them to grow mentally, personally but most importantly spiritually. One of the primary roles of a church is to help groom young people to minister to the world. Matthew 28:19 -20 says," Therefore, go and make disciples of all the nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit. ²⁰ Teach these new disciples to obey all the commands I have given you. And be sure of this: I am with you always, even to the end of the age."

In today's world, youth ministry is needed more than ever. It should be our goal to focus on youth ministry and to find ways to spiritually engage our young people. Deserved or not, youth ministry is immensely criticized. This criticism

causes the ministry as a whole to become very challenging and discouraging especially to the youth pastors. Because of this strain, the church as a whole should act as the backbone to youth ministry, empowering and providing assistance wherever possible.

When you take a step back and look at our world, youth ministry should be the most vibrant and important ministry in a church. If you don't have a thriving youth ministry, then you don't have a future. Although, many people see youth ministry as a baby-sitting program for teenagers to keep them "out of trouble" or "off of the streets;" the purpose of youth ministry is to motivate and equip young people to be our leaders of tomorrow.

Often times we as adults tend to ignore the voice of the youth, but we forget that when we ignore the voice of the youth we fail to prepare for our future. Both young people and youth ministry ought to be taken seriously! Youth Ministry is real ministry and youth leaders do a lot behind the scenes work that the church at large doesn't see. There are several challenges when it comes to youth ministry, but the blessings and growth seen in the young people is worth it. When it comes to youth ministry support from the church at large is crucial. Show the youth that they matter by just being there and learning a few birthdates or names. When they have programs, or outings, go to support and encourage; if you can't, make it sponsor a child or the department financially. One thing I learned over the years is youth ministry is the only church ministry where numbers matter. If they don't feel your support or see you supporting them physically, when the church has a program going on it will be harder to get them to attend/participate.

Youth ministry reflects the culture of a church more than people realize. The same way that trends in fashion come and go while reflecting and foreshadowing what the new upcoming thing is, youth ministry reflects the same thing in a church. It is our job to empower our youth and work together in finding ways to reach others who don't know Jesus.

If our goal is not to help ouryouth develop a personal relationship with Jesus Christ by providing them the resources to grow in worship, ground them in the word, and give them opportunities to witness and serve others; what are we really doing? Do not expect to see greater things in youth ministry than what is happening in the church or even in the homes. My hope is that we are raising young people who are committed to Christ, committed to the Mount Olive Seventh-day Adventist Church, and have the Christian Leadership experience to make a difference in recruiting souls for the kingdom of heaven.

For the upcoming New Year, let's challenge ourselves to really get to know our young people. What are their likes and dislikes. What are their strengths and weaknesses. You wouldn't believe the difference it would make in not only church evolvement but their lives.

Why did you choose your current career and what do you think are the best skills you bring to your job?

When applying for university, Social Work seemed like the option that was meant for me. I considered other careers, but none of those other options worked out.

How do your days play out as a young, Christian professional? Do you experience any pressure? If so, how do you handle it?

I find time for God in the mornings and evenings with a prayer before I get up, and one before I fall asleep. Family worship is also a practice in my home, and so we always end the day with prayer as a family.

I don't feel like I experience any pressure at this point. With the field I'm in I try to be open and accepting of all people. My co-workers and I are all respectful of each other's beliefs and boundaries

What experience in your life, if not too personal, solidified your relationship with God?

I think a broad example would be my experiences in my profession. I had a lot of anxiety about what career path I should pick for the rest of my life, but all the other paths that weren't right for me just never worked out. I was still nervous when I started university, until a (non-Christian) professor drew a parallel between the goals of Social Work and the life of Jesus, and encouraged us to use His approach to people as a guide in our practice. That kick-started a real desire in me to be more like Jesus.

What would you like to see more of in 2019 at Mt. Olive? How would you like to be involved in accomplishing that goal?

It would be great to see Mount Olive continue to grow and serve the community. I am impressed by the work done by Cossetta and the Community Services department and would love to see it continue. 

ETOBICOKE ROAD SAFETY CHALLENGE 2018

In conjunction with Toronto Public Health, Toronto Police Traffic Division, Arrive Alive, Toronto West Caer Community Awareness & Emergency Response and MADDd, the proceeds were used to sensitize the public especially children on Road Safety.

Many wonder what they can or cannot consume on the Daniel Fast. The primary goal is to feed the spiritual rather than the physical.

Included:

All fruits—you name it—fresh (preferred), canned frozen or dried!

All vegetables —you name it—fresh (preferred), canned frozen or dried!

All whole grains including quinoa, whole wheat, brown rice, oats, barley, grits, etc.!

All nuts and seeds—this includes nut butters like peanut butter!

All legumes-canned or dried!

All quality oils—olive, safflower, grape seed, sunflower etc.!

Water—distilled, spring or other pure water!

Excluded

No chemicals!

No sugar- raw sugar, date sugar, syrup, honey, molasses, cane juice, stevia, agave or artificial sweeteners!

No beverages besides water!

No meat or animal products- beef, lamb/goat, poultry, fish etc.!

No dairy- milk, cheese, butter and eggs!

No leavened bread including Ezekiel Bread (contains yeast and honey) and baked goods!

Nothing refined or processed foods!

Nothing deep fried-chips and fries!

No solid fats—shortening, margarine or foods high in fat!

Remember read the labels on prepared foods to make sure ingredients comply with the fast.

Fasting or abstinence from all or some food and drinks for a period of time. We fast for physical and spiritual cleansing and to gain control of appetite, gain victory over indulgences that limit our time with Christ. The Ontario Conference has set aside the first Wednesday of each month in 2019 for Stewardship Mid-Week Prayer Time. Here are a few pointers as you reflect on your stewardship to God.

Biblical Stewardship: The Truth About Money

Biblical stewardship requires that a Christian view money differently from the way the secular world views it. The secular world equates affluence with success and happiness. Therefore, society constantly struggles to acquire as much wealth as possible. The Bible, however, exposes the worthlessness of such a struggle by revealing the truth about money.

Biblical Stewardship: It's About Heart

Biblical stewardship calls a Christian to give back to God through tithing. The word "tithe" merely means "a tenth." A Christian, therefore, ought to set aside a tenth of his or her income for God. For God, tithing is not only about a percentage. Tithing has more to do with one's heart during the act of giving then the actual amount given to God.

Biblical Stewardship: That Which is of True Value

Biblical stewardship does not require that a Christian despise money or to discontinue earning it. Money is a necessity for basic living. The Bible does warn, however, that the love of money creates evil (1 Timothy 6:10). It is important not to allow money to become the center of one's life. When money is not the object of one's love and devotion, one is free to focus on higher things.

Biblical Stewardship: Giving to Others and Making a Stand

Biblical stewardship provides help for the less fortunate. The Bible states, "Religion that God our Father accepts as pure and faultless is this: to look after orphans and widows in their distress and to keep oneself from being polluted by the world" (James 1:27). Giving does not end with tithing. God asks that the giving heart be extended to those who need it most-widows, orphans, and the poor. As a Christian, one must reach out to those in need, sharing the blessings one has received from God.
